Instructions for authors



$5^{ m th}$ Spanish Young Statisticians and Operational Researchers Meeting

This document provides detailed instructions to prepare abstracts for the 5th Spanish Young Statisticians and Operational Researchers Meeting (SYSORM), to be held in Sevilla (Spain) on 5th-7th November 2025. It is essential that submitted abstracts follow the guidelines outlined below in order to have homogeneity among all of them.

General guidelines

- The abstract must be written in English.
- Abstracts must be written in LATEX using the style contained in the zip-folder

Please do not modify the SYSORM.sty file.

• The abstract must fit on one page. Kindly note the template automatically trims the content to one page, producing a warning in the log file. Be sure that the last reference you want to include is actually displayed in the compiled pdf.

Abstract's preparation

Use the template **abstract.tex** file (which calls the SYSORM.sty style file and references.bib bibliography file) to write your abstract, run IATEX, and produce your own pdf file.

Please name the abstract file as "Surname(s)_Name.tex", the bibliography/references file as "Surname(s)_Name.bib", and the output PDF file as "Surname(s)_Name.pdf" for submission.

The document consists of 6 different parts, namely, title, authors, bio, abstract, keywords and bibliography, which must be written in accordance with the following instructions:

- 1. TITLE: Provide the title of your contribution. The title should be concise and informative.
 - Do not overcapitalize the title as in "An Example Title". Write instead "An example title".
 - Please avoid using acronyms in the title, as well as mathematical symbols.
- 2. AUTHORS: Provide authors' information.
 - Specify authors' names and surnames, using as many \textsuperscript{} as different author's affiliations. If an author contributes to more than one submission, please make sure his/her name and surname appear always in the same format.
 - Indicate authors' affiliations writing the Company, Research Center or Department and University along with the Country. No address information should be included.

- Include (\Letter) inside the \textsuperscript{} of the corresponding author.
- Include an active e-mail address of the corresponding author.
- Also include the \indexauthors{} information for later indexing of authors in the book of abstracts.
- 3. BIO: Include a short bio of yourself. Note that this bio is mandatory, as it helps the rest of the participants to know your background, research interests, etc.
 - This section must be 4-6 lines long. Please do not provide a shorter or longer bio to ensure homogeneity among all abstracts.
 - Include your complete name and surname as specified in 2. AUTHORS (e.g. do not add a second surname here if you did not specify it in part 2). Do not use abbreviations.
- 4. ABSTRACT: Separate the abstract into two different paragraphs.
 - Use the first paragraph to introduce the context and state-of-the-art where your contribution is circumscribed. Keep in mind that the audience in the conference will be a mix of researchers in Statistics and Operations Research, so giving some background to your contribution will be useful.
 - Detail the contributions of your work in the second paragraph. Try to be precise and clear, avoiding vague statements such as "some results will be presented".
 - The weight of both paragraphs should be roughly the same, so please avoid having a long context/state-of-the-art paragraph followed by a short and unclear contributions paragraph.
 - Feel free to add equations, figures, or tables to your abstract. Please type them using the standard LATeXcommands.
 - Figures must be numbered consecutively and their captions must be placed beneath the figure. Please provide your figures in EPS, PNG, JPEG, or PDF format.
 - Tables must be numbered separately from the figures. Please make sure that every table is preceded by a caption.
- 5. KEYWORDS: Provide some keywords describing the content of your abstract.
 - Include between 3 and 5 keywords.
 - Write them in alphabetical order, separated by semi-colons, and in lowercase. Please do not remove the period at the end.
- 6. REFERENCES: Provide some references in connection with your abstract.
 - Include between 2 and 5 references.
 - Use the references bib file provided in the zip-folder, which includes some examples of bib entries for books, papers, preprints, proceedings, and software.
 - As shown in the examples, please do not write the complete author's name, only their initial letter and the author's surname.
 - If available, include doi, arXiv, or url to link references and facilitate their checking.
